To demonstrate a high level of responsibility, make sure you can master these skills:

- Trustworthiness
- Discretion
- Motivation
- Consideration
- Accountability

Taking responsibility means taking ownership of not only your goals but the wider company goals. This will mean taking the initiative to make improvements, accepting responsibility for any failures and really caring about working your way to success.

5. TEAMWORK:

Like leadership, good teamwork involves a combination of other soft skills.

6. PROBLEM SOLVING:

Problem solving does not just require analytical, creative and critical skills, but a particular mindset: those who can approach a problem with a cool and level head will often reach a solution more efficiently than those who cannot.

This is a soft skill which can often rely on strong teamwork, too. Problems need not always be solved alone.

The ability to know who can help you reach a solution, and how they can do it, can be of great advantage.

7. DECISIVENESS:

Decisiveness is characterized by the ability to make quick and effective decisions. It does not mean recklessness or impulsiveness.

Decisiveness combines several different abilities:

- The ability to put things into perspective
- Weigh up the options
- Assess all relevant information
- Anticipate any consequences, good and bad

A decisive employee will take effective and considered action quickly, especially when under pressure:

They take responsibility for the consequences of their decisions and can adapt when mistakes are made. This ensures that opportunities aren't missed by lengthy analysis or debate.

8. ABILITY TO WORK UNDER PRESSURE AND TIME MANAGEMENT:

Many jobs come with competing deadlines and numerous high stakes. Recruiters place emphasis on those who show a decisive attitude, an analytical ability to think clearly, and a capacity to compartmentalize and set stress aside.

Time management is closely related to the ability to work under pressure, as well as when tight deadlines. Employees who manage their time well can efficiently prioritize tasks and organize their duties while adapting to various shifts along (help to take on new tasks and deadlines).



9. FLEXIBILITY:

Flexibility is an important soft skill, which is demonstrated as ability and willingness to embrace new tasks and new challenges easily and without fuss.

Flexible employees are willing to help out where needed, take on extra responsibilities and can adapt quickly when plans change.

Employers are looking for candidates who can show a willing and upbeat attitude, and who are confident to change.

10. NEGOTIATION AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION:

This is another of those soft skills which employers look for in potential **employees.**

To be an **expert negotiator** is to have the ability to persuade and **convince** someone, while **eventually** making a solution which will benefit all parties.

Similarly, conflict resolution depends on strong interpersonal skills and the ability to establish a rapport with colleagues and **manage** them.

SOFT SKILLS TRAINING PROGRAM:

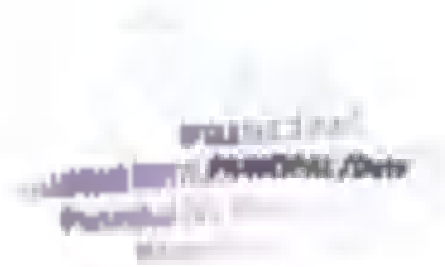

A fully equipped language lab serves to all the under graduates, post graduates and all students of the College. Language lab holds regular training-AYMATELL (Audio- Visual Self Assessment Techniques Language Learning) where spoken skills are taught. Spanish English, UGC approved (1) Descriptive English (2) RPD -SLE, ODF Courses are held. Mock Interviews are held. Training for higher education is imparted in the form of coaching for GRE, TOEFL and IELTS to students outside college also.

The Department has a modern Language Laboratory with state-of-the-art multimedia equipment to aid in improving language skills. The Laboratory is effectively utilized by students and faculty members for various self-entertainment and self-study development activities. Laboratory proves beneficial for those students who are poor in use of English language. Students from rural areas who are generally weak in English will have sufficient ear training in the language lab. It aims at confidence-building among students by interactions and presentations in English. The basic purpose of the lab is to provide students a platform to enhance English language skills, communication skills and to practice soft skills.

Language Lab shall have two parts:

A. Computer Aided Language Learning (CALL) Lab

B. Interactive Communication skills (ICS) Lab



A. COMPUTER ASSISTED LANGUAGE LABORATORY (CALLL):

The Computer Assisted Language Laboratory (CALLL) uses computers to teach language. The course materials are already fed into the computer and are displayed according to the features available in the course. Nowadays, there are also laboratories with computers with a connection to the Internet.

B. INTERACTIVE COMMUNICATION SKILLS (ICS) :

The ICS LAB is a spacious room with movable chairs and audio-visual aids with a P.A. System, a T. V., a digital stereo -music system, LCD projector and computer etc. This lab provides opportunity equally to 30-40 students to interact and make presentations at once, thereby helping them improve their language proficiency, communicative competence and comprehension skills. This laboratory focuses with student activities under the efficient supervision and guidance of the instructor as a purely activity/task based.

FUNCTIONALITY:

The levels of functionality of current language labs vary from manufacturer to manufacturer. All labs will have a level of teacher control to manage student lessons / dialogues. The more sophisticated "software only" labs have a higher level of teacher management and control over the student's desktop. One of the key differences with the "high end" software only products is their ability to work "live"

with the students as they read and work with texts. In instead of waiting to correct student readings after they have been recorded and collected back it is now possible for a teacher to work simultaneously and live with students on their own, in pairs and in groups, thus enhancing the immediacy of the teaching and learning experience. The next generation digital language labs allow teachers to monitor, control, deliver, group, copy, review and collect, audio, video and web based multimedia content. The student computer is linked to the teacher console and can play audio, video and web based systems. Systems can record, stop, start, go back to last exercise, record, fast forward, repeat phrases and bookmark.

BENEFITS AND ADVANTAGES OF LANGUAGE LAB:

a) Accuracy The language lab provides all benefits, in terms of when they are used in the room, equal opportunity to hear the instructor and to be heard by the instructor. Each student can listen to the lesson material as a level set by themselves for their own needs. None of the lesson material is misheard due to the direct nature of the sound transmission heard by each student via his or her individual headset.

b) Privacy The headset/microphone provides students with a psychological privacy that promotes their speaking ability. It reduces the inhibition felt in normal classroom situations and encourages the shy student to speak. The instructor can speak to a single or group of students in privacy without disturbing the rest of the class.

c) **Overcoming Shyness** The use of a language learning system encourages students to talk freely and lose their inhibitions when talking in front of their peers. Lab systems tend to make students more anonymous.

d) **Attention** As the language lab allows the student to listen to the program separately, each individual student's attention is focused on the program material being studied, ultimately increasing the attention span of the student and teaching the student to listen and analyze the content of the lesson.

e) **Individualization** Labs provide the capability for dividing the class into several groups. These groups can be learning to different programs on varying subject matter and at different levels of difficulty.

f) **Developing Listening Skills** The language lab helps students develop good listening skills and aids the process of communication. Students hear the correct language patterns all the time through their headphones instead of catching other students who may be pronouncing incorrectly.

g) **Self-Pacing** The students may work through the lesson material at a pace suited to their ability. The lab is for them a personal tutor.

h) **Native Speaker/Assistant Voice** The lab provides the students with a variety of useful voices rather than just the voice of the teacher (who is often not a native speaker). All modern systems have a Model Voice (usually allowing a native speaker to converse and be used as a model voice subject for the rest of the class).

i) Efficiency: The language lab makes most efficient use of time, improving the teacher/student class ratio and allowing the instructor to maximize the use of time in a given lesson. In a single teaching session, individual students can have more opportunity to speak than during an entire semester in an average class of 30 students.

ii) Variety: The language lab provides variety both in program content and situations. The teacher's role is changed and the students are more active for longer periods of time. The use of visual stimulus coupled with selective audio materials increases the attention span of the students.

iii) Record/Comparing: The students have the ability to record their own voice along with the master stimulus. Each student can be working independently on different segments within the same program or be working with completely different program material.

iv) Simplify Record Keeping: The instructor can easily generate records of attendance, grading and oral responses to true/false or multiple choice taped tests. An automated record keeping process can save much time.

v) Oral Testing: Oral test features allow instructors to test students with a question or stimulus and only record the student's answer. Instructors can then play back the recorded answers at a later time for grading, without having to listen to the questions.

ai) Teacher Monitoring Since the teacher is not concentrating on producing the final question or skill, he/she can concentrate more on the students' responses. The instructor has more time to produce questions and answer them activities due to the substantially, rather than manually, controlled instruction outside lessons.

aj) Role Playing Exercises Using the random pairing/random grouping feature that all advanced modern learning systems incorporate, instructors can generate a variety of exercises structured around role-playing. Students can be paired or grouped together in small groups and hold conversational practice with each other. Due to the random selection of student partners and the students' interest level is always high in anticipation of who their paired partner is likely to be. The instructor can also allow the students to listen to a situation from the console allowing the students to practice with each other while responding to the master console.

ak) Building Student Experience Students can build on their existing experience and gain further knowledge of computers while learning in the computer language lab. Practicing with systems, software and new applications enhances important skills. The more experience students have with computer technology, the more successful they will be in the "real world".

al) Internet Access The new generation of multimedia systems allows the students to be connected to the World Wide Web and to be able to access information for a global class. This allows instantaneous access to information worldwide.
